Loss of Collective Innocence

I have just finished watching an old episode of a comedy show where in one scene the two comedians live together in a house whilst performing a series of hilarious and over the top skits. In one particular skit, they are sharing the same bed in their pyjamas whilst the drama unfolds around them filled with light double entendre dialogue. When I first saw that scene many years ago I thought it ever so funny. I watched it today with old eyes, wondering what were they thinking doing a scene like that, what message does it say to today's generation, and how it would never be acceptable to film that type of content today for fear of offending someone or some group. I fear I have lost a major part of my humour, lost my ability to get lost in the moment, and lost my innocence to laugh at a scene that was only ever made to provide light-hearted humour, but has now could become a weapon for some elements of society, to weld their power and influence over others. Something has changes during those intertwining years, and I don't think it is for the better.

Societies have short memories, especially with respect to bad memories or things they find difficult to accept. It is normal collective behaviour, to distance oneself from self-inflicted scars, past atrocities and wars, and leave them behind in the history books to collect dust again. For it is a never-ending cycle, because once the healing process is over, society enters an innocence regained period of flag-waving nostalgia, celebrating national holidays and perceived good time again attitude. We always look back into our historical past with rose-tinted glasses, thinking they were idealised times, when in fact they were brutal, painful and times of suffering. We forget far too easily, as we are fed lies, disinformation and accept the false message that we have never had it so good. Elements of society may be better off materialistically, but has this come about through the bankruptcy of our environment, health, minds and souls, and disfranchising the weaker and less well-off elements of our society that never had a voice? We have forgotten to keep asking who is getting rich from this, who is benefitting and who is ultimately paying for it. When we stop asking this question, bad things start to happen, accountability disappears and the law of the jungle begins to run operations.

I am afraid to say that the world has lost its collective innocence, as we have now crossed the lines of literal and psychic Rubicon into a much darker, hate-filled and scarier world where anything goes. Ex-Presidents will stop at nothing to stay in power, hiding ghastly acts from public view, scandals appearing day after day, more and more unacceptable behaviours from more and more radical groups unwilling to listen or compromise. When the rich and power write the rules to allow them to pay less tax (Panama/Paradise/Pandora Papers – they keep coming don't they!) than a supermarket cashier, whilst earning thousands of orders of magnitude more than them. When police arrest people then abuse or murder them (George Floyd and Sarah Everard you shall never be forgotten). When parents in a first world country are eventually detained for perpetuating a campaign of child torture, and the child is heard sobbing that they want to go to his nanny, because no-one loves them and no-one is going to feed him today (Arthur you shall never be forgotten). When a cyclist is rammed by machete-wielding masked armed robbers on motorbikes in broad daylight in order to steal his bike. This is not the behaviour of a civilised society; we are actually living in a dystopia that our leaders have been hiding from us.

The real power players don't like being in the limelight, for they put up muppets and puppets to do their bidding, so they will act as fall guys when things go wrong. With so many inept leaders, bad decisions being made everywhere, inefficiencies evident in all aspects of life, it feels like corporations are pulling the rug from beneath the feet of governmental organisations in an attempt to start asserting their authority. There are some corporations that are more powerful than smaller nations. Corporations and the power brokers behind them don't have our best interests at heart, for they are formed to make money for their shareholders, and they don't care how many people lose their jobs or die in the process. The rise of private armies (Wagner Group, Blackwater Security Consulting/Xe Services/Academi) and secret mercenaries who are both covert and lethal willing to fight or cause chaos for whatever multimillion-dollar business is willing to fund them through illicit means is frightening.

Mercenaries are more powerful and heavily armoured than experts realise for they don't fight conventionally or follow any Geneva Convention rules of engagement or human rights, which is a very grave oversight. Corporations are fed up working in dangerous places of relying on corrupt and inept security forces are turning to other private means of achieving the required outcomes. The private armies may be being used against terrorist or to protect financial assets at the moment, but what happens when they start challenging and beating regular armies, navies and national cyber protections around the world? After being driven and operating for 150 years underground, private armies and the market for force is returning in a few decades and growing at an alarming pace. What is appearing in third world countries, will soon appear in space and offshore colonies, where the super-rich now become superpowers, and all people that live within their sphere of influence follow their laws, rules and forms of justice. For the commodification of war, justice and world order is stark; those that have the means to control violence get to make the rules that others must follow or die. We must watch the bigger picture such as when one company is paid to start a fire or proxy war, that requires mercenary groups to be deployed.

Supply can generate its own demand in a free market for force, and could even be used by the super-rich as a way of settling old commercial scores. Private military companies hide behind proprietary knowledge and trade secrets, switch to plausible deniability when a coupe or mission goes wrong, threaten media outlets with lawsuits and what is to say they could make problem people asking the wrong questions disappear. Mercenaries/Private Security Firms, like drug/people trafficking, sex exploitation and terrorism is an illicit economy that resists investigation of any sort. Money talks, but you may not like what it is saying. This sector occupies the moral and legal grey areas of world affairs, undertaking asset tracking and recovery, international investigations in dangerous areas, sly investigations to find internal leakers, threat assessments, opposition research, spying on competitors, corporate espionage, perform dirty tricks, intimidation, shaping operations to manipulate situations on favour of client interests or when hired by the super-rich doing whatever they want.

The world is turning into a giant souk or open market where everything is up for sale and must be bartered for. In this unregulated space, there is treasure to be found, but often at the expense of scamming, double-crossing, defrauding and deceiving the general population who are consider amateurs, ripe for plundering. There are no refunds, returns or exchanges, the buyer should beware, people are seen as expendable. The professional class

operating in these areas are more carefree when it is not their blood that will be split for they have minions to take the blame and fall in their place. As we seek more and more security in an uncertain world, we will be buying more and more weapons of war in case of conflict, and the risk of an inadvertent catastrophe thereby increases daily. When wars both physically and in cyberspace can be initiates without states, this will only accelerate global chaos. When the super-rich have the ability to start wars on others because of a perceived lack of respect gesture or slight offence or injustice, in which thousands may die quickly and then escalate into a worldwide conflict is becoming a real possibility. The repercussions for humanity are truly horrifying. The COVID epidemic and blockage of the Suez Canal has shown the effect of a small glitch in manufacturing and logistics chains has on our daily lives, a small local proxy war in the wrong area could close down the entire world economy, leading to food, water and energy crisis, propagating huge migrations of people the likes the world has never seen. Humanity is so vulnerable not only from climate and environmental issues, but from the worst of human nature that is just bubbling below the surface.

The true colours and complexities of the world are now coming into view now, as people have previously had their attention averted but now are waking up to a nightmare and can no longer avoid what is happening on their streets which requires national introspection. How long can we hide behind our collective doors, blindfolded to what is out there, what injustices are being conducted in our name, what tragedies are occurring and the direction of travel our society is taking, which on the current trajectory isn't looking good for a lot of people. Let us at least be honest with ourselves, the reason that space exploration is looking so good for so many billionaires is that they are looking for a way out from impending mess, that they have helped construct. Ironic really. We were promised that people we trust have long standing valued relationships with key people and our best interests at heart, and supposedly live by high ethical and moral standards that include respect, openness and transparency, but words and just words, however they can be cheap and worthless however high they start from. It is by our actions, outputs and outcomes that we shall be judged.

We are waking up to the fact that a lot of what we have been told is just hot air. There is something rotten at the core of our society that is beginning to smell, taste, sound and feel not right. It is beginning to smell like a dead fish. It is beginning to taste like overcooked food that returned to the kitchen, been reheated and served up too many times. Intimidation is another tool in their toolbox as fear is a strong emotional reaction, and if you are upset, it bolsters their ego. They will demand a lot from people they prey on, and this will have a detrimental effect on others wellbeing, with the additional stress leading to anxiety and depression in some. Once you start to recognise these behaviours, you can start establishing boundaries (times and places you don't let them enter), don't agree to put in the same vicinity as them, adjust your expectations by shutting off your emotional value and not offering any advice (you can't fix them), don't give them an inch (when they don't get the energy from you they will look elsewhere), guard your emotional capacity (body languages, facial expressions, hand positions) and cut them out entirely. You don't need permission to excise this person from your life entirely, and be free of the vampires. This may seem dramatic, but you need to look after and protect yourself first. They don't care about you, except as prey to suck energy from. Start to know one when you first see one.

Spending time with toxic people can be terribly and five times more destructive than any compliment. Vampires are not the only toxic people; watch out for gas lighters, people who avoid responsibility, inept people (in their defence, they were invariably left unsupervised or promoted into roles that were way beyond their level of competence), self-destructive people, people who just criticise, people who are always jealous and people who care about their image too much. It's not healthy to stay with people that don't even bother to ask how you are. You are not required to set yourself on fire to keep other people warm.

Voyeurs stand and stare and do nothing. Selfish people don't care about you, unless you are doing something for them. Stop running back to or explaining yourself to people who don't care about you. When people treat you like they don't care, believe them. They don't care. People don't care for you when you are alone; they just care for you when they are alone. Sometimes you have to give up on people, not because you don't care, but because they don't. Your life will get better when you realise it's better to be alone than chase people who don't really care about you. Ninety-five people don't care about your problems; the other five percentage are happy you have them. Actions prove who someone is, words just prove who they pretend to me. Most people will not care for you. Don't make time for people who can't make time for you. Don't be afraid or embarrassed by who you are; they're going to judge you no matter what you do. If you care too much about what other people think, you will always be their prisoner. You must not be afraid of your uniqueness and you must care less and less what people think of you. The world is full of nonsense, bullshitting and selfish people. They may not see you, not even consider you or not give you any of their time.

Never surrender to them, don't sacrifice yourself to them and don't give them any of your time, because if you sacrifice too much there's nothing else you can give and nobody will care for you. It's sad how people claim to love and care about you, but they are really empty inside and they will replace you so quickly. Don't live to impress the voyeurs and people that really couldn't care less about you. That's wasting your life!

Voyagers assist you on your journey. If you want to keep your relationships with good people going, you need a lot of positive interaction; that is why relationships are such hard work. Pay attention to people that care; who are always there; who want better for you; they're your people. Appreciate people who really care for you. You never realise how many people care about you until they all turn out to support you. Don't push away people who truly care about you because one day they won't come back. The people who truly care about you won't have to tell you they care; they'll show you. Caring for someone is easy, but to make someone care for you is difficult, so never lose the one who really care for you. Be with someone who will take care of you, not materialistically, but take care of your soul, your well-being, you heart. Be who you are and say how you feel, because those who mind don't matter and those who matter don't mind.

Along your journey, it is during the worst times of your life that you will get to see the true colours of the people who say they care for you. You have to realise that not all people will care for you the way you care for them. The people who really love and care about you will always surface in time and stay in your life. When you truly care for someone, their mistakes never change our feeling because it is the mind that gets angry, but the heart still cares. Love yourself enough to set boundaries. Your time and energy are precious. You choose how you use it. You teach people how to treat you by deciding what you will and won't accept. Only those who care about you can hear you when you are quiet. The world is full of people who need someone who understands; never take for granted or forget to show your loved ones and friends how much you care. Never give from the depths of your well; but from your overflow. Care too little and you will lose them; care too much and you will get hurt.

There is a danger of caring about others more than yourself, for you can't really continue to look after others, unless you look after yourself first. Talk to yourself like you would to someone you love. You can't really be present for the people in your life, if you aren't taking care of yourself. When you love someone, you let them take care of you. People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care. When two people really care about each other, they will always look for a way to make it work, no matter how hard it is. Never stop showing someone how much they mean to you.

Rise of the Incompetents

Incompetents overestimate their own skill levels, fail to understand genuine skills and expertise of others, and fail to learn from their own mistakes. They are totally absorbed and might even exhibit narcissistic behaviours. People usually do admit their deficits, once they can spot them. Beware of the man who has read one book for a little knowledge is a dangerous thing. no one is created equal. Just because it's easy for you to do does not mean it is easy for others. And no one is perfect!! No single human knows all there is to know on

any one subject and we all have pockets of incompetence we don't recognise in certain areas of knowledge. This is really dangerous: thinking you're capable when you are not. Those who think to know, never learn. When you play chess with a pigeon, it's just going to poop on the board and strut around like it won. Incompetents make mistakes and reach poor decisions, and the knowledge gaps prevents them from catching those errors, so they therefore carry on making them. Poor performs lack the very expertise to recognise they are doing badly.

If you can't stand the fatigue of learning, then you have to hold the pangs of ignorance. The further you go up the education system, the more you understand that you know nothing. It takes a considerable amount of knowledge just to realize the extent of our own ignorance. I realize you have recently graduated from high school and I would venture to guess that most of you think you know everything. Let me assure you that as you gain your bachelor's degree, you will soon realize that you DON'T know everything. If you continue to the point of reaching your master's degree, you will find that YOU DON'T KNOW ANYTHING. And then, if you continue with your education, you may someday receive your doctorate only to find that NOBODY KNOWS ANYTHING. The more you know, the more you know you don't know. He who knows everything doesn't learn anything, and he who learns everything doesn't know anything.

The problem in this world is that intelligent people are full of doubt while incompetents are full of confidence. The key here is to acknowledge one's limitations, to recognize how much each of us has yet to learn. Far too many simply refuse to do this, it's painfully evident. Beware the Peter Principle that states that people tend to be promoted to a level above their competence. Avoid this with effective training and hiring processes. Imposter syndrome is loosely defined as doubting your abilities and feeling like a fraud. It disproportionately affects high-achieving people, who find it difficult to accept their accomplishments. Many question whether they're deserving of accolades. The Dunning–Kruger effect is a hypothetical cognitive bias stating that people with low ability at a task overestimate their own ability, and that people with high ability at a task underestimate their own ability.

People usually can admit their deficits once they spot them, and recognise their initial attempts and performance as awful. Therefore, people who only have a moderate amount of experience or expertise often have less confidence in their abilities. They know enough to know they don't know it all, and are willing to learn. Experts know how knowledgeable they are, and know when to ask for help, guidance or to seek additional knowledge. People are often caught in a bubble of inaccurate self-perception.

Ask for feedback from other people, and consider it, even if it's hard to hear. When you are largely self-taught, you always had the problem that you don't know what you don't know. Constructive criticism is like gold. When you ask employees to do a self-evaluation, they know that their future promotions depend on how good others perceive their abilities. So, it is not in their self-interest to publicize the fact that they are below average, even if they are aware of it. Incompetent people think they are amazing because they display illusory superiority and forge ahead on their own decisions and instincts, when they should instead be seeking out advice. People should always keep learning. Psychologically, we are not very good as listening to others or evaluating ourselves accurately. Those with the least ability

tend to be delusional and overrate their skills to the greatest extent, especially in terms of logical reasoning, financial knowledge, driving abilities, mathematics, grammar, emotional intelligence and playing chess, comparing themselves to actual experts. When arguing with a fool, make sure the other person isn't doing the same thing.

The higher up you go in organisations, the less people there are to judge whether the top management are doing their jobs properly. People tend to be promoted based on their current performance in the job right now, not on their ability to take on new and more demanding roles. Most leaders are incompetent, whether in business or politics, or both, and thus have a negative effect on their followers and subordinates. People are not very good at distinguishing the difference between confidence and competence, with confidence having more potential for leadership, especially if this is linked with charismatic individuals. We want leaders to be charming and entertaining, when in fact the best leaders are humble often to the point of being boring. We can't help admire famous people and we have an innate inability to resist the allure of narcissistic individuals, those that don't care about what others think of them if they think they are great, then they must be great. Incompetent leaders see leadership as an entitlement, so they lack the empathy, self-control and ability to listen to others. They end up acting without integrity, indulging in reckless risks and not caring about other people.
